During a phone call tonight with Secretary of State John Kerry, President Obama said that the democratically elected government of Turkey should be supported, according to a statement from the White House. The president and Kerry also agreed that "all parties" should "show restraint, and avoid any violence or bloodshed."-----

The president's remarks come just as 17 police officers were reported killed in a helicopter attack on their headquarters on the outskirts of the Turkish capital, Ankara. "General Hulusi Akar, Chief of Staff of the Armed is held hostage by a group of soldiers who attempt an uprising," the agency said citing "reliable sources". According to several media, social networks were cut in Turkey, which was confirmed by the US State Department.

Turkish state television aired Friday night a statement from the "Turkish Armed Forces" reports of the proclamation of martial law and a curfew on the entire Turkish territory.-----

"We will not allow the peace is degraded in Turkey. (...) A curfew is imposed on the country until further notice ", especially indicated in a statement signed by the " Board of peace in the country ", who says he" took control in the country "while as helicopters flew over the Turkish capital Ankara after flying at low altitude combat aircraft.-----

Erdogan denounced an "uprising of a minority within the army". The strong man of Turkey, who spoke by telephone on the CNN-Turk news channel said, "I absolutely do not think the coup succeed." According to CNN Turkey, Turkish President Recep Tayeb Erdogan was set security and will speak in a few moments in Turkish people.
